Parkman Trustees Notes

From Kevin O'Reilly

The Parkman Township Board of Trustees has a new member. Nancy Ferguson was elected to a four year term and will serve along with Pat Joyce and myself. Be sure to welcome Nancy if you see her in town.

As township trustees we are responsible for overseeing how your tax dollars are spent. I use the term "your tax dollars" collectively as Pat, Nancy and I are also taxpayers in Parkman. I thought I might use this column to introduce you to our township budget. The township receives funds from several sources which include real estate property tax, motor vehicle license tax, gasoline tax, special assessments and fees. I have created the following table to show the breakdown of where the money is projected to come from. Remember this is only a projection and is based on expected revenues. On occasion the state has made major adjustments (always down) to what we receive.

Now I will outline where the money is allocated to be spent. This is where it gets tricky because several sources of revenue are "earmarked" and can only be used for their specified purpose. Examples of this include money collected from the fire department levies, Road & Bridge levies and the street lighting district assessment.

General Fund	\$310,545	Includes parks, building maintenance, salaries, etc
Road Department	\$331,960	Road maintenance and equipment
Fire Department	\$83,430	Fire department operations
EMS	\$8,755	EMS ambulance operations
Cemetery	\$14,935	Cemetery operations and upkeep
Street lighting	\$3,193	Street lighting electric usage
Total	\$752,818	

You can see that we have not allocated all the possible revenues to allow for reductions in income or possible unforeseen expenses. It is also important to understand that each area of the budget allows for money to be carried over from the previous year. This allows the township to continue operating until the new taxes are received in February and March. Additionally the fire department has a savings plan where money is set aside each year to build up for replacement of fire trucks. This allows the township to operate without borrowing money.

I have only outlined the budget in broad categories. If anyone is interested in more details please come to one of the trustees meetings and we will be happy to share more details with you. As residents and taxpayers of Parkman Township the board of trustees has a duty to be fiscally responsible while working to provide for both the needs and the desires of all Parkman residents. Thank you for your continued support and confidence in us to make the right decisions.

EMS ReportJanuary 2010

And a gracious cold, snowy winter to you all! Don't you just LOVE the northeastern Ohio weather? OK, don't panic, I know what the majority of our residents are praying for... the return of sunshine and warm temperatures.

What's new in EMS? I spent a morning with Brent Politzer from Troy FD this week to set up our squads so equipment and supplies are in the same place on each squad. We respond together. All of Troy or Parkman's EMTs and firefighters should now be able to find anything needed on the scene quickly and easily from any of the ambulances. We are constantly looking for ways to improve our care to the communities we serve.

We are looking into purchasing a LUCAS (Lund University Cardiopulmonary Assist System) device to provide automatic mechanical chest compressions in a cardiac arrest. Studies show it's easy to handle, light weight and quick to apply. If it saves lives, it's worth consideration. More on this in the next newsletter.

Ricky Pierce is nearing the end of his Paramedic training. He has put in hundreds of hours (as they all do) in the classroom, hospitals and on various squads besides working for Community Care. We look forward to using his new skills on our department.
