A few jobs require you to be at least 18 years old (and many of us are WAY over that age) but teens are more than welcome to volunteer their time and work in the dining room or behind the scene in the kitchen. Parkman Trustee Notes

Spring is on the rise and winter is still here and we are following one of the hottest summers on record. As many of you are aware we are having a very difficult time maintaining consistency of our roads with the freezing, thawing and raining etc. In January most of the gravel roads turned to muck. We had some equipment down time with no replaceable parts available and had to try to salvage the 25 year old parts. By the time this is printed I hope we have frozen maintainable roads. We are still looking into the best solution for these roads and are finding many conditions in need of attention. Some of our road beds have more than a foot thick layer of crushed limestone residue (mainly dust) which are not able to support any top surface that will hold up, this is the reason we are getting so many potholes. That being said we are looking into various approaches to resolve these problems. We are formulating a ten year plan that is budget worthy and reasonable. Please be patient and we will keep you posted as this develops. We are planning to do repairs on Stagecoach and Forge Hill roads in the spring. We are attempting to share some resources with Trumbull County Engineers to aid in cost reduction for this project. We are also looking at repaving Grove in 2018 if a grant can be obtained from the state.

Our Fire Department has been working diligently with Troy and also W. Farmington to begin a blending process to help maintain a quick response to all in need. They are now toned out for all calls in Troy and Fire calls in W. Farmington. Due to this blending 2016 ended with 531 calls for our responders. We have added to our resources by some of our people receiving additional training for EMT, and Paramedic; and have attracted some new members to help with staffing. We can always use additional help, if you have any interest stop by or call 548-2515. We supply the gear and help with the training.

We plan to continue our off-site meetings and will announce these in advance. Everyone is welcome at any meeting and we hope to see you at one or more to get an opportunity to provide firsthand information and receive your input. We are looking for a Cemetery Sextant to replace Dale Komandt, he wants to retire, please contact Dennis Ikeler or any trustee if you have an interest in this.

The sign in Overlook Park was vandalized this fall and we have a new one ordered. The park is provided to residents for use free of charge and it is a shame people feel the need to destroy the property adding additional cost to our budget.

In 2016, Parkman Fire Department responded to 505 calls for service, this includes responding mutual to areas as far away as Bloomfield.

We secured a Federal Grant of over \$21,000 for new fire hoses and nozzles to go on the hoses, a State of Ohio Department of EMS Grant in the amount of \$2,500 for EMS Training and supplies, and also acquired a Regional State Grant with Troy in the amount of \$140,000 to replace 16 sets of firefighter protective gear and both departments' hydraulic extrication gear, better known as 'jaws of life'. In total, the nearly \$165,000 dollars will, or has, replaced outdated and under powered equipment to better serve the citizens and visitors of Parkman and Troy Townships along with neighboring departments as well.

As we begin 2017 Parkman Fire will continue blending our operations with Troy Fire Department. This will continue to be a top priority throughout the next few years as blending topics are finalized with Troy's New Fire Chief Eric Mathews.

This winters' milder temps has kept the number of Chimney fires to a minimum. Please remember to clean your chimney on a regular basis if you burn wood in any type of appliance on a regular basis. Smoke detectors and CO detectors do Save Lives. These are quite cheap to purchase considering the life saving potential these detectors bring with them.

Parkman Fire Department is always looking for training opportunities like Cars for extrication trainings allowing us practice new and more efficient techniques of gaining access to trapped patients in the event of vehicle crashes, and buildings that are capable of allowing us to practice new techniques of searching for victims in the event of fire, and even training to rescue ourselves in the event that one of our own needs rescue. Buildings are the hardest thing to come by, and sometimes can be burnt for training purposes, and are nearly invaluable to the Fire department. Feel free to contact the fire department with any questions.

From: Matt Urie, EMS Officer

I am excited to help with Parkman Fire in 2017 and beyond. Taking over the EMS officers' position is a great honor, and I am excited to do so. With being in Fire and EMS for 12 years, I feel that I can help Parkman Fire achieve a standard of care that is beyond what our community ever anticipated. In 2016, Parkman Fire has had three new employees achieve the certification of paramedic, three current employees obtained EMTs, and this number will continue to grow as two more members are starting paramedic education in the spring. This allows us to provide our residents with the highest level of EMS care possible. With our mutual aid partners in Troy and Middlefield in Geauga County we can also help those communities in their times of need if called upon. I hope that when you have to call 911 in an emergency, you can be comforted in knowing that the best trained and professional EMTs and Paramedics will be tending to your emergency.

We have some plans to upgrade some of our EMS equipment with help from grant monies from the State of Ohio. This helps decrease our operating budgets and help us stay current with the best and most up to date equipment.

If you have any concerns, questions or feedback positive or negative, please feel free to contact Chief Komandt or myself at the Fire Department. If neither of us are in station, please leave a message and we will be sure to get back to you as soon as possible. I look forward to this new role within the fire department.
