I hope everyone is having a warm and happy new year. As winter leaves us we will be getting out to begin road maintenance as soon as possible. With the deep freeze I am noticing some road damage happening in a few areas and will be monitoring it and making proper repairs. I realize with the freezing and thawing that the dirt roads open up with holes. We will be out trying to grade when the road conditions will allow us. Maintaining the dirt roads and trying to keep the holes out of them is our top priority however weather conditions sometimes don't allow for that to happen. Unfortunately just like many other things currently the cost of road materials like gravel and grindings are on the rise. I will continue to work with the trustees and try to be sure we get what materials we can to take care of the roads.

This spring and summer please use caution if you see us working on the roads. Some projects and maintenance may cause us to close one lane while we work. We will try to keep a constant flow of traffic to minimize inconvenience. If you have been one who has called and request fill dirt or would like to be on a list, please contact the road dept. cell phone and I will be sure to get you on the list. If you were on last years list please call so I can update the list and amount of fill you are looking for. We have many ditches that need cleaned however we have very limited areas to dump the dirt so any help will be appreciated.

I would like to thank those who utilize the recycling bins in our parking lot and thank you to those who pick up some lose items which may blow out and we don't see. Remember its posed so that you are on camera and that no garbage or large items are to be left outside of the bins or in the parking lot. These bins are for recycling purposes only.

I hope everyone has a wonderful safe and healthy spring and remember that if you have any questions for the road dept. we are only a phone call away.

Hi everyone this is John Spelich your Township zoning inspector. This past summer, zoning had a time to gather and get rid of unwanted signs throughout the township. There are regulations on where you can have a sign and the size of the sign.

For example section 702.0 item A - Signs are prohibited in all districts of the township.

- 1. Signs that prevent the driver of a vehicle from having clear vision
- 2. Signs that interfere with government
- 3. Roof signs
- 4. Mobile signs

Now what signs are permitted?

- 1. One real estate sign per lot
- 2. One sign per development and or sub-division
- 3. One name-plate per lot
- 4. Directional meaning enter and or exit
- 5. Temporary may be OK if the owner of the property says OK but only for 30 days

Parkman's Flags

There have been many kind words expressed on the new flag in the Parkman Veterans Memorial Park. It can be seen flying in all directions. Many thanks to Roger Anderson (past trustee) for the effort to organize and have the old & broken Parkman flag pole replaced.

Also - don't forget to thank the Baptie Family when you see our flags on light poles during Memorial Day holiday. These flags were donated in 2021 by Cindy Baptie Derifield in memory of her father Mr. Kenneth Baptie (1927 - 1984) who served in the Navy in World War II.

Kenneth marched in every Parkman Memorial Day Parade in his dress uniform.

Soon after the soldiers returned from World War I, they organized the Clifford Thompson Post of American Legion with a membership of 23. Some of those most interested were: James Farley, Pearl Brown, Walter Mintern, Aulden Hazlett, Charles and Carl Haight, Oscar Irwin, Guy Agler, Ernest Hillock, and Howard Fram. The Legion was named after Clifford Thompson, son of our minister, who was Parkman's only casualty of World War I. Ray Johnson, Walter Minter, Guy Agler, and Oscar Irwin are the only members still living. Oscar Irwin is the only one living in Parkman. The Legion planned to build a place for their meetings. At the same time the Mothers Club was looking for a building or a place to build. It so happened that the Old Creamery building, then owned by John Ohl, was available. So with the help of several people, with both labor and money, the Legion and Mothers Club bought the building. Many dinners and dances and receptions have been held at the hall.

In 1822, after the formation of the 1st Militia Company in Parkman, the ladies united in furnishing a flag by contributing fine linen of their own spinning. The painting of the stars and stripes was done by Barton Avery. When completed, it was presented to the company by Miss Sophia Doty with an address by Mrs. Daniel Owen. Her speech has not been preserved, but the following is a copy of the remarks made to the Ensign by Captain Fairbanks upon acceptance of the flag:

"Ensign, it becomes your duty to take charge of this flag, a present from the patriotic ladies of Parkman. Although in times of peace it is used for parade and ceremony, yet, remember in times of war, it serves as a rallying point for the soldiers. your liberty or your life. "

This was the first flag owned by any company in the county and at the following training at Burton, the Parkman Company marched in front of the others carrying the colors of "Old Glory".

Not once in its years of existence has Parkman lost sight of its ideals of patriotism for the stars and stripes have been unfurled as a standard for the present as well as the on coming generations.

I have some photos & stories of past Parkman Veteran Honorees, but the effort is ongoing.



Established in 1946, as Parkman Veterans returned home from WWII, this club was a gathering place to allow fellow members recoup from enduring the stress of such an experience. This later was evolved into the Middlefield VFW Post 9768, that still exists to date. Most of the founding members were very active within the Parkman community.

IN MEMORY OF THE PIONEERS OF PARKMAN - OUR FIGHTING MEN ALL CITIZENS OF PARKMAN - IN THE FIRST CENTURY AND A HALF

Below are a couple excerpts about early Parkman Veterans from this 1976 rendition that were written by: Dawn Hall, Arlene Gotham, Madelaine Dietz

The whole complete story is now digitally archived and on the Parkman Website!

Another family who have lived there since 1931, is the Stanleys. They had a large family. Their old home has been removed and Marion and Leonard Hickox built a home nearby, Lillian Miller owns a home on Owen's Road. John built a fine house on Nash Road, Sister Elaine is a nurse and lives in Pakistan. One brother, Richard, was killed in Germany, February 3, 1945. Two sisters, Marcella and Elizabeth, died of disease. Their parents were very hard working people. John is a trustee and I am sure a very good one. He married a pretty lady, Jean. They have two daughters: Jane and Jeanette; and one son.

The following names are taken from a list of soldiers in the Revolutionary War from Kent State University:

Joel Cross, Cpl. New York Militia Asa Doty, Massachusetts Artillery Samuel Donaldson, Pvt. Connecticut Militia Benjamin Smith, Ensign Connecticut Militia

Besides the soldiers of the Revolutionary War, we should also mention:

Zechariah Hosmer Seth Phelps (father-in-law of Parkman founder)

Reuben Curtiss Jonas Carter

Elisha Bundy Private Woods, Massachusetts Militia

William French Sgt. Brewers, Massachusetts Regiment

During the Civil War 79 answered the call, and 24 in the War of 1812. In World War 1 - 22 was the quota, and only Clifford Thompson, son of Rev. Thompson, failed to return. He was a very fine young man and had high inspirations. In World War II, 120 were on the honor - roll, of that number 8 men did not return: Gerald Owen, son of Mrs. Grace Thorpe and Cecil Owen (deceased), was the first casualty in Panama City, Florida, in 1943. John, Quinn, son of Jim and Joe Quinn (they were very wonderful people--now deceased), was killed in action in France in December 1944. Richard Pollari died in Germany in 1945. The Pollari's were a very admirable family, two daughters became nurses, Kaarlo became a teacher, and Edward a businessman. Dick Stanley died in Germany in 1945. He was from an outstanding family living on State Road. Joseph Turocy died in a Veteran's Hospital some time later. Turocy's lived on a farm once owned by Mr. War Ohl, and now owned by Rollin Stoll. Forrest Smith, son of Howard and Allice who bought the O. C. Smith farm, died in eastern France, December 13, 1944. Michael Tackacs was killed in action. He was the son of George Tackacs, who lives on one of the pioneer Moore's property. John Ferry, son of Mr. and Mrs. Lee Ferry, was captured after the fall of Corregidor and remained a Japanese prisoner until September 1944 when the prison ship was sunk. That was very sad for all people in Parkman. Mr. Lee Ferry is now deceased.

Parkman Fire & Rescue



From Mike Komandt - Parkman Fire Chief

Parkman Fire Department had its busiest year on record in 2021. We received 591 requests for emergency response including total incidents in the following categories and does not account for all incident types.

Fires – 82 Service calls -19 EMS - 386Good Intent – 58 Transport - 189 False alarms- 11 Hazardous conditions – 32

This represents over a 32% increase in service requests over 2020, and our response times remain the lowest we have had in recent years. On average it takes us less than 1:30 to respond to emergencies, with daytime responses averaging less than 45 seconds. We constantly strive to respond in the quickest and most efficient manner.

In 2021 we also were able to obtain numerous grants through local, State, and Federal sources in the total of over \$14,000. We continue to request funding to bring Federal and State tax dollars back to the local community and have requested over \$215,000 to support critical needs of the department in 2022.

Parkman Fire is also able to provide Smoke alarms to residents free of charge through a cooperative with the Red Cross. If you need smoke detectors, please contact the fire house and we will provide and install those free of charge.

Remember SMOKE DETECTORS SAVE LIVES!!!

We will soon be able to offer CPR courses to the residents and businesses of Parkman again!! If you wish to attend one of these courses, please contact the fire department. You may see us out and about at the local schools and daycare teaching fire prevention throughout the year. If your establishment would like to participate, or visit the fire house, please reach out to us so we can schedule an onsite or fire house visit.

Parkman Fire Department is always looking for dedicated volunteers and part time personnel. If you are interested in serving the community, please stop in the fire house and pick up an application. All certification training courses for township residents are fully funded by the fire department. We look forward to continuing the highest level of professional service to our community into the future!


