Parkman Trustees Notes

It is hard to believe that summer is over and winter is soon upon us. Several major projects that will forever change Parkman are almost complete and the Ohio Department of Transportation is working on a new one that could completely reconfigure the downtown intersection.

Most of the residents within the new sewer service area are now hooked up to the County's wastewater treatment system and the remaining homes north of town should be hooked up very soon. This improvement to our town that has been in the works for close to 30 years is finally complete. The smells that used to come up from the Grand River in the summer will now be gone and the water will be much cleaner; a benefit for both people and our environment.

The route 422 reconstruction east of town is very close to completion. Although much controversy surrounded the scope of the project, the reconfigured road will result in a safer road for those living along it as well as those traveling down it. Before long residents living on Hobart and Farmington Roads will once again feel safe as traffic moves back onto 422.

The new project ODOT is planning could result in the addition of new turning lanes and possibly the loss of properties in the center of town including the Flagpole Park. A historic preservation board has been formed to attempt to save our town center. If you are interested being involved in this, please contact Lucinda Sharp-Gates or any of the trustees.

Trustee Pat Joyce is working with a group of residents to acquire grant money to update and expand the equipment and parking at Overlook Park. So far they have secured \$7500 and need to come up with local matching funds. They will be looking for help with fundraising to get the match money needed to fulfill the grant.

On the road front we ask that you please be patient as our road superintendent, Tom Evers, prepares the roads for winter. The 26 miles of gravel roads are prioritized based on which ones are the most deteriorated. If you live on a township road be assured that your road will be graded and stoned as soon as practically possible.

As always the trustees welcome your participation at our meetings and would welcome your concerns or compliments. Please stop in at one of our meetings and say hello.

Parkman Township Trustees have been awarded a \$7500 Challenge Grant from Kool-Aid & KaBOOM Cleveland last August. Only 5 grants were available for the Cleveland Area. This is a **matching funds grant** and Parkman Township must raise \$7500. So there will be a lot of FUNdraising activities to plan. It is also a **Community Build Project** meaning that we need **volunteers** to help in the build. This is a great opportunity for Parkman and we look forward to the success of this project. Sandie Parnaby is Coordinator of the project, assisted by Trustee Pat Joyce. Other members of the core committee are Athletics-Mike & Candi Peters, Education/Recreation-Meghan Hull and Environmentalist-Alan Siewert. The grant will focus on expanding our playground to add play areas for the 0-2 and 3-5 year olds. Also play equipment designed for the handicapped and a junior fitness area. It will be an exciting year for everyone involved. The more money we can raise the bigger our playground can be. Improvements to other areas of the park are in the overall plan.

U.S. 422 *GEAUGA COUNTY *UPDATE*

(Main Market Rd.) Reconstruction, Parkman and Nelson Townships
Paving is complete, only minor operations remain. Crews hope to reopen westbound U.S. 422 on or around Friday, November 14, weather permitting. Westbound traffic remains detoured via SR 5 to SR 82 to SR 44. Eastbound traffic is maintained. The entire project reconstructs U.S. 422 to include four driving lanes and a center turn lane between SR 88/528 and the Portage County line. Minor operations, including landscaping, will continue into the spring of 2009. Only minor impacts to traffic are expected. Tentative completion date: May 2009. Please exercise caution in work zones. At the end of October 2008, the Buckeye Off Road Adventure Club merged with the Lake County Off Road Conservation Inc. This merger unites members of both groups under the OMTA network (Ohio Motorized Trails Association) community. Parkman Zoning Inspector

In the second half of 2007, the zoning commission made changes to the zoning resolution that affect the minimum side yards for all buildings and minimum distances between buildings for accessory buildings located in a R-1 Residential Zone. The minimum side yard for all buildings is now 25 feet. It was 20 feet. The minimum distance from an accessory building to any other building is 20 feet. Previously, there was no minimum listed distance from another building. I encourage anyone interested in becoming more familiar with the Zoning Resolution to stop in at the zoning office any Wednesday evening between 7 and 8:30pm to review the resolution in further detail. The Summer went by fast and now we have to think about Winter. We are currently preparing the trucks and equipment along with the roads for Winter and we continue addressing the roads till the snow hits. Just a Few Reminders for Winter: Keep your leaves from your trees from blocking your driveway pipe.

The snow from your driveway Does Not belong in the Road. The Township is Not Responsible for snow coming off the snowplows damaging your mailbox.

Some good news Middlefield Twp and Parkman Twp has been awarded State Issue 2 money for improving Newcomb Rd. Our section will be from Shedd Rd to Patch Rd. We will be widening and ditching the Road, preparing it for a road bed of 28 feet which would allow in the future for 24 feet of Pavement and 2 foot berms on both sides. The work will begin Spring and Summer of 2009.

Parkman Historic Preservation Commission

David Short from ODOT District 12 came earlier this summer to report to the Trustees on the survey project done on the 422/88 intersection and traffic. Mr. Short indicated that ODOT would try to offer alternatives to the issues of traffic configuration and safety. The project is due in 2011 giving the Township time to plan and respond to another assault on the community.

From this the Parkman Historic Preservation Commission was born with the following community members: Lucinda Sharp-Gates, Jean Giles, Dale and Lynn Komandt, Bernice Wells, Reuben Byler, Elmer Weaver and Jane Zajackowski. The Commission has met twice with plans to pursue National Registry for the Township Center to deter and/or defer the ODOT project.

The Commission is using the Geauga County Historical Society expertise in this endeavor as well as tapping other resources within the County. Dale Bartholmew, a director for Century Village has supplied us with the information from Burton Village on their Historic Preservation project. The process is a long and arduous one with both State and Federal guidelines for the project.

U.S. Post Office - Parkman

News from the Parkman Post Office:

As our frequent customers have found, person(s) unknown came into the Postal lobby and caused some mischief the week of Halloween. No real damage was done, but a mess was created and had to be cleaned up. Then the flag and flagpole attached to the front of the building was taken a few days later. All of this is vandalism and theft on Federal Property and can result in Federal Prison time if the person(s) are caught. Any information about these activities can be directed to the Postmaster, our 1-800-USPS HELP line (ask for the Postal Inspectors) or the Geauga County Sheriff's Department.

If these types of activities continue, we will be forced to close the lobby in the evenings and on the weekends, when the Post Office window is closed. This would mean that the community would no longer have 24 hour lobby access to their PO Boxes. Why? Because of some kids out causing mischief! We ask the community to keep an eye out on the Post Office and to report any unusual activity to the Sheriff's Department.

On a happier note, Christmas is just around the corner. We have the 2008 Christmas stamps in stock. The Virgin and Child with the Young John the Baptist is based on the painting by Italian master Sandro Botticelli from around 1490. The painting is in the collection of the Cleveland Museum of Art. The other design offered this year is a collection of 4 different Holiday Nutcrackers. Also, if you need a Duck Stamp for hunting season, stop in, they are \$15.00.

For Mailing overseas to our troops, keep these dates in mind; the recommended mail-by dates for APO-FPO's for Iraq or Afghanistan is Dec 4th, Dec 11 for all other Military Mail, and Dec 18 for Express mail. We will be happy to help you any way we can to get your Christmas Presents to their destination in time.

There will be a special Lobby Drop Box during December for all Letters to Santa. Help your kids improve their writing skills with a Letter to Santa. All letters, with return addresses, will be answered.

AS CHIEF OF YOUR FIRE DEPARTMENT I WOULD LIKE TO THANK ALL FOR THE PASSAGE OF THE FIRE LEVY

A FEW MONTHS AGO, I WAS AT A COUNTY FIRE MEETING IN CHAGRIN FALLS. IT WAS THE FIRST TIME I THINK HAVE EVER BEEN IN THEIR FIRE

STATION. WHILE WE WERE HAVING ORU COUNTY MEETING, THE FIRE FIGHTERS FROM CHAGRIN WERE ALSO HAVING A TRAINING CLASS ON NEW SCBA'S, (SELF CONTAINED BREATHING APPARATUS), WHICH THEY HAD JUST PURCHASED WITH FUNDS FROM A FEMA GRANT. AT PARKMAN WE HAVE BEEN TRYING TO OBTAIN THE SAME GRANT FOR THE SAME SCBA'S FOR THREE YEARS. UNFORTUNATELY WE HAVE BEEN TURNED DOWN EACH TIME.

AFTER THIS MEETING MY SON (ALSO A FIRE FIGHTER ON OUR DEPARTMENT) SUGGESTED I CONTACT CHAGRIN AND SEE WHAT THEY WERE DOING WITH THEIR OLD SCBA'S. I NEED TO LET YOU KNOW THAT THEIR "OLD" UNITS ARE ABOUT 10 YEARS "NEWER" THAN OURS WERE. ALSO THEY ARE ABOUT 15 LBS. LIGHTER THAN OURS. WE USE STEEL OR ALUMINUM BOTTLES IN OUR SCBA'S AND CHAGRINS ARE SPUN FIBER, WHICH ARE VERY LIGHT.

AFTER ABOUT A WEEK OF SUGGESTIONS FROM MY SON, I CONTACTED CHIEF ZUGAN IN CHAGRIN TO SEE WHAT THEY WERE DOING WITH THEIR OLD UNITS. CHIEF ZUGAN SAID THAT THE DISPOSITION OF THE UNITS WAS UP IN THE AIR BUT HE WOULD DISCUSS IT WITH THE OFFICERS AND MEMBERS. ABOUT A MONTH LATER CHIEF ZUGAN LET ME KNOW THAT THE MEMBERS HAD VOTED TO DONATE THE UNITS TO PARKMAN IF WE STILL WANTED THEM. WE ACCEPTED!!

WE HAVE PUT THESE UNITS IN SERVICE AND THE BACKS OF OUR FIRE FIGHTERS ARE REJOICING. CHAGRIN DONATED TO US OVER 25 PACKS (HARNESSES AND REGULATORS) AND OVER 50 BOTTLES. EVEN AT USED PRICING THE VALUE OF THIS DONATION IS OVER \$50,000.00.

THE FIRE DEPARTMENT AND YOUR TRUSTEES HAVE SENT "THANK YOU'S" TO THE CHAGRIN FIRE DEPARTMENT, BUT IF YOU ARE IN CHAGRIN AND NEAR THEIR FIRE STATION, STOP IN AND SAY THANKS TO CHIEF ZUGAN OR ANY FIRE FIGHTER. I'M SURE THEY WOULD APPRECIATE IT.
