

Parkman Township Trustees Regular Meeting of April 17, 2018

The regular meeting of the Parkman Township Trustees was called to order at 7:00 p.m. at the Parkman Community House. In attendance were: Trustees-Roger Anderson, Jon Ferguson, and Dennis Ikeler, Fiscal Officer- Nina Reed, John Spelich-Zoning, Diane Ryder-Maple Leaf

* An agenda was made available and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

*D. Ikeler moved and R. Anderson seconded a motion to pay the bills. Motion carried unanimously (Resolution No. 18-77)

*R. Anderson moved and D. Ikeler seconded a motion to approve the meeting minutes from April 3, 2018. Motion carried unanimously (Resolution No. 18-78)

*J. Ferguson moved and R. Anderson seconded a motion to approve up to \$20,000.00 to repair or replace the generator on 4221, work to be completed by Bridgeway Cummins. This will be reviewed by Mr. Ferguson and Mr. Russell. Motion carried unanimously (Resolution 18-79)

Zoning:

* Zoning information requests on two parcels on the Ambler Road sub-division, requested setbacks information along with utility information that was on s/l 19 and 21.

*Received from Planning Commission the final and complete legal description along with executed and approved deed on consolidated lots 18-018 with a total of 7.0854 acres all held by BTE properties

*John D. Fisher completed his application for an 800 square foot addition to his existing house located on Newcomb Road. All paperwork was in order and a permit was issued

*Sent out two non-compliant letters to 15950 Main Market Road both were returned so I hand delivered to the same address. No response at this time. Will give him 15 days on the final notice

*Sent a non-compliant letter to 15875 Main Market Road the owner has a shed on skids its square footage is more than allowed. A permit is needed for this

*Talked to Ted Wojtusik on his burned out house located on Main Market. He said that he is still in the process of tearing down and to rebuild the existing home

*This is a follow up on a non-compliant home occupation located on Farmington Road. I sent two letters with no respond back so I did an onsite visit at 17795 Farmington Road and they did clos up show. They said it didn't work out.

*Received an e-mail from GPD Engineering out of Akron. They were proposing upgrade construction to the substation on Main Market, they wanted information on needed permits and road right away. I sent them to the County Engineer and Sate of Ohio.

*Next Tuesday's zoning meeting will discuss medical marijuana. 30 days after this meeting the trustees will hold a meeting during the 2nd meeting of May to review the denial for the growing of medical marijuana.

Fire:

*King and Morehead have been fitted for gear and it has been ordered

*4221's generator is not working. Technician was out on Friday 4-13-18.

Technician was unable to find and fix the problem. 4221 is going to Bridgeway Cummins on Friday 4-20-2018 unsure at this time how much repair will cost.

*Requisition's turned in for Ohio Cat repairs to 4221's pump shift for \$5,658.18 and for our part of the hose grant to Middlefield Fire for \$1,375.00

*King has completed his training shifts and is now able to work shifts.

Roads:

*Ditched and cut berms on Payne and Rutland

*Graded all roads and drug them

*Looking at new driveway pipe to be installed on Hosmer. This is going to be tough because of all the rock in the ditches. A jackhammer will have to be rented to complete this project

*Open and closed a grave site

*Repaired roads from wash outs

*Had to close Swine Creek road on Sunday night due to flooding

*3 permits for driveway pipe

*Will be doing ditches on Bradford next

*The right away on Newcomb has not been steaked out yet

*Applications rec'd for Road Department worker. These will be reviewed by each trustee and then decided on who should be brought in for interviews

Community House:

* Furnaces are installed just waiting on electrician to hook up the air conditioners.

*Chamber is interested in sharing the cost of the new sign. Will look at including the Fire Department as well so all three will share the sign.

*Scrap behind the building from old furnace will be taken to scrap yard by road department

Old Business

* Closing of the Post Office: Received a phone call from Channel 5 News. News Channel 5 completed an interview with Mr. Ikeler in front of the post office. Mr. Ferguson has spent days on the phone with the postal service discussing the changes that are coming with the closure of the post office. Right now the move is temporary as they are looking for a new location to put the post office. There will be a community meeting held at some point but no date is in place. Individuals who have never had the option of receiving mail at their home now have the option to put up a mailbox and receive mail. They are to contact the postal service to determine what mail carrier will deliver to them. There are 58 people who did not have this option before and were given free P.O. Boxes. These individuals can also choose to keep their box but have it located in Middlefield.

For those who have paid for a box they will receive the box in Middlefield until their lease is up.

It is important that no one changes their address until after April 28th if they want home delivery. It will take up to 10 days to have the address changed.


The township will look at getting mail delivered to the physical address but will keep the P.O. Box for now.
